ETHICAL DECISION MAKING AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST A guiding checklist for Councillors, Officers and Advisory Committees

Ethical Decision Making

- Is the decision or conduct legal?
- Is it consistent with Government policy, Council's objectives and Code of Conduct?
- What will the outcome be for you, your colleagues, the Council, anyone else?
- Does it raise a conflict of interest?
- Could your possible conflict of interest lead to private gain or loss at public expense?
- Can the decision be justified in terms of public interest?
- Would it withstand public scrutiny?

Conflict of Interest

A conflict of interest is a clash between private interest and public duty. There are two types of conflict: Pecuniary
– regulated by the Local Government Act and Office of Local Government and, Non-pecuniary – regulated by
Codes of Conduct and policy. ICAC, Ombudsman, Office of Local Government (advice only).

The test for conflict of interest

- Is it likely I could be influenced by personal interest in carrying out my public duty?
- Would a fair and reasonable person believe I could be so influenced?
- Conflict of interest is closed tied to the layperson's definition of "corruption" using public office for private gain.
- Important to consider public perceptions of whether you have a conflict of interest

Identifying Problems

1st - Do I have private interest affected by a matter I am officially involved in?

- 2nd Is my official role one of influence or perceived influence over the matter?
- 3rd Do my private interests conflict with my official role?

Whilst seeking advice is generally useful, the ultimate decision rests with the person concerned.

4.0 PUBLIC FORUM

4.1 Cr Paul Braybrooks OAM, Cootamundra Shire Council & REROC Chairman Cr Braybrooks thanked Council for the opportunity to explain the proposed REROC Joint Organisation (JO) concept model. It was noted that the JO and each individual councils potential merger options are completely separate issues. Cr Braybrooks advised that REROC have nearly 20 years proven experience working well together and that the Mayor and General Manager of each member council make up the REROC Board.

- JO concept and boundary changes are separate issues
- High degree of uncertainty in local government, reasonable to feel threatened
- JO concept will be for the benefit of State Government
- Cautioned the rural council model
- Make an effort and continue to join in otherwise may be targeted
- Wagga is essential to the EOI for the REROC JO concept which is to be further developed, focus on resources and regional issues
- Implications for the cost of services over distance
